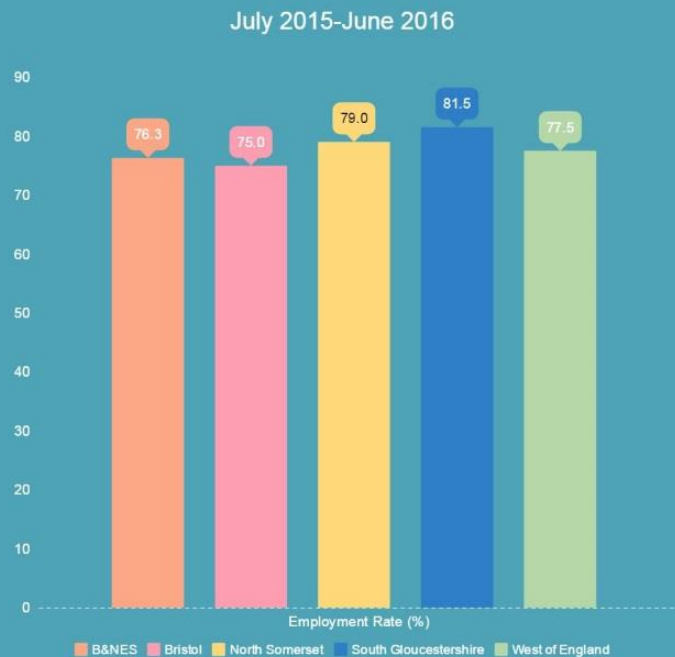

For the West of England Authorities

Of all the areas in the West of England, South Gloucestershire had the highest employment rate of 81.5% in the year to June 2016, and Bristol had the lowest (75%).

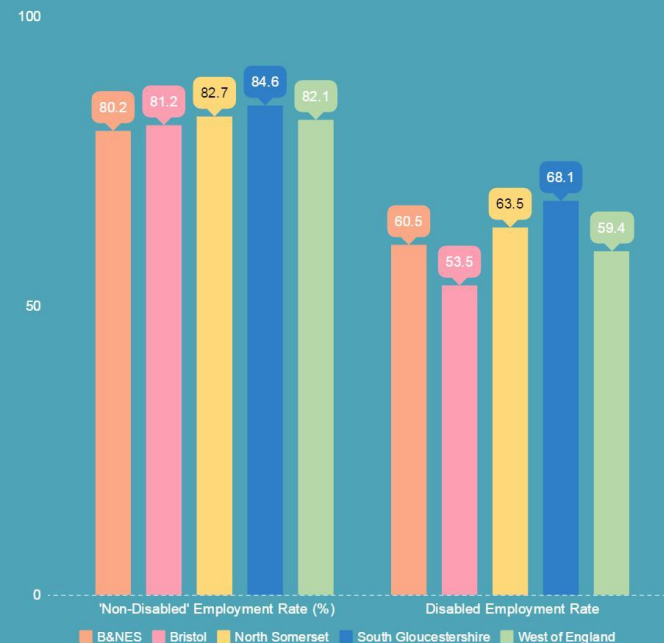

Employment rates

Disabled and Non-disabled

Of all the areas in the West of England, South Gloucestershire had the highest non-disabled employment rate of 84.6% in the year to June 2016, and B&NES had the lowest (80.2%). In the same time period, 68.1% of South Gloucestershire's 'disabled' working age population were in employment; the highest rate in the West of England. Bristol was the lowest at 53.5%.

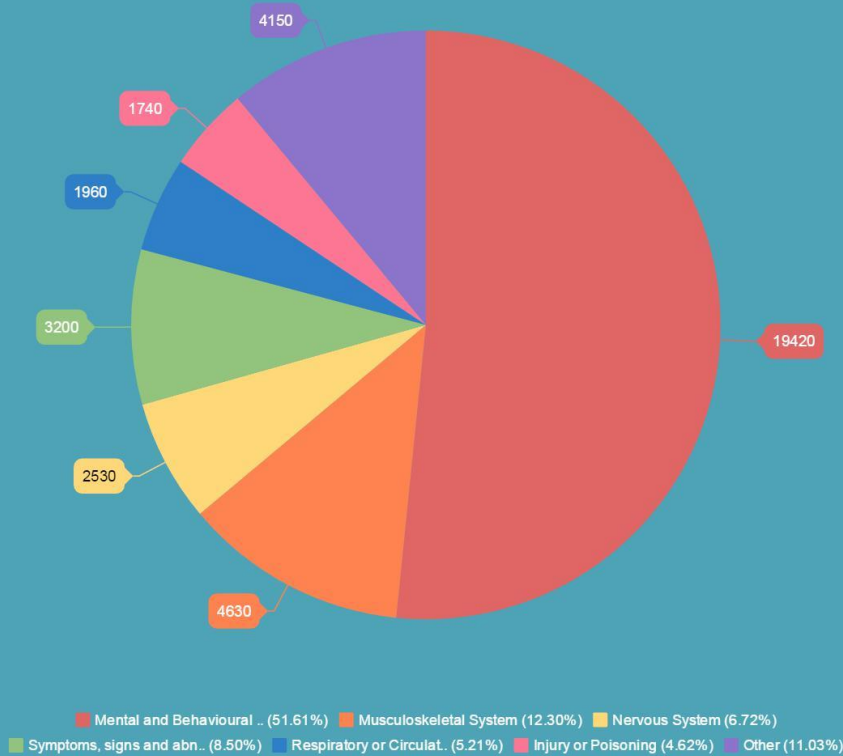

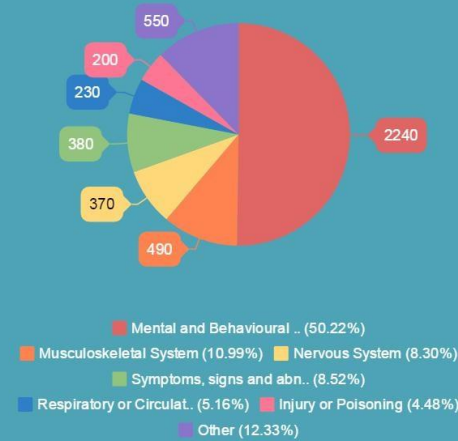
ESA Claimants by Health Reason

The proportion of ESA claimants for each health reason are broadly consistent across the four areas.

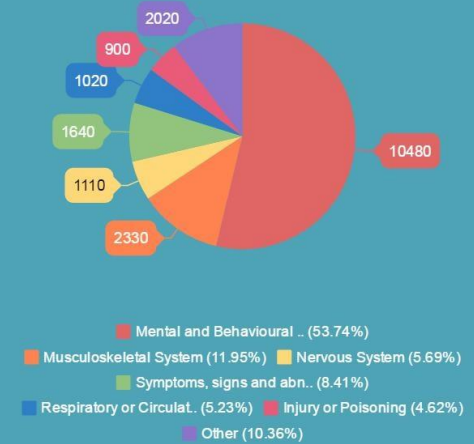

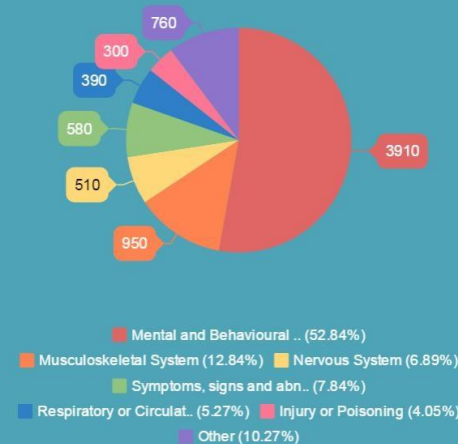

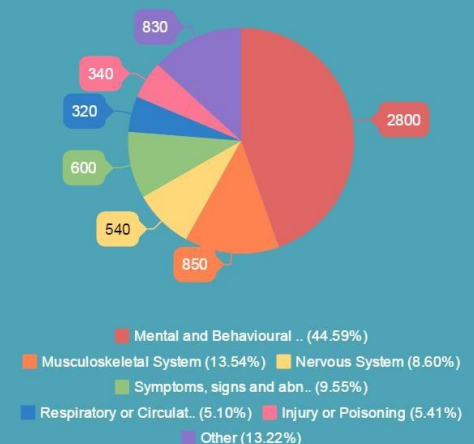
